
# OUTLINE OF NAGASAKI UNIVERSITY 2013





### Nagasaki University's Philosophy

Nagasaki University contributes to the improvement of a well-balanced society by transmitting its inheritance of the traditional culture rooted in Nagasaki, cultivating a fertile creative sense in students, and developing innovative science for world peace.

## Nagasaki University's Fundamental Objective

In order to realize its philosophy, Nagasaki University has been promoting the advancement and individualization of education and research under its fundamental objective expressed as, "Nagasaki University continues its role as a 'center for the transmission of intellectual information' which is indispensable for the world, while moving forward together with local society." Also, during the period of the new mid-term goal, maintaining this fundamental objective, we will continue to develop the clear direction of our organizational policy and the student character in order to lead the intellectual growth of society in the 21st century.

#### Nagasaki University aims:

- (1) to integrate our distinguished research areas of tropical and infectious diseases, radiology, and marine environment biological resources and other fields such as food resources and environment to become an internationally renowned education and research center
- (2) to further advance, individualize, and internationalize education and research, as well as to create influential research results and produce world-class scientists.
- (3) to foster sufficient, extensive ability at the bachelor's degree level through the coordinated arrangement of both professional and liberal arts education as well as to strengthen the organizational development of the graduate school's education curriculum, leading to a neverending line of Nagasaki-University-brand professionals.
- (4) to contribute to a more active, sophisticated, and internationalized education of the local community, its medical care, governmental administration, industry, and economy by giving back to society prominent educational and research achievements which can serve as the driving force of decentralization.
- (5) to promote collaborative research at our overseas research hubs in Asia and Africa as well as improve the development courses for professionals who wish to dedicate themselves to work in international contribution and cooperation for the sustainable development of developing countries.
- (6) to nurture students' dreams and their human potential, maximizing their abilities as well as improving the environment in order to help young scientists become independent and to create a university campus where young people full of determination and spirit are gathered.
- (7) to directly link reviews and evaluation results to the improvement of education, while reforming the university management system organizationally and continuously, thereby enhancing the management framework of university cooperation.

# Historical Sketch

On November 12, 1857, Dutch army surgeon Pompe van Meerdervoort initiated medical lectures in the Dutch language to government doctor Ryojyun Matsumoto and11other persons. This medical school called Igaku Denshusho is the origin of today's School of Medicine as well as Nagasaki University.

## Center for Industry, University and Government Cooperation



## Nagasaki University Logo

### Formal Logo



The formal logo was designed in 1949 to raise a sense of common bonds among university members and to provide moral support for them in developing as a university. A Dutch ship representing Nagasaki, the only door for the Western culture during the Period of Isolation, has the initial letters of Nagasaki University "N.U." on its bow as well as the Chinese character "大學" meaning "university" at its right.

With its reorganization into a National University Corporation, the existing symbol mark was modified on April 1, 2005 to establish the formal university logo.

### Informal Logo



The informal logo was designed on April 1, 2005 for use in a variety of more casual occasions.

The yellow line in the center stands for "Students and Faculty", while the green line on the right is for the "Land Area of Japan and Its Territory" with its rich natural environment. The blue line on the left represents the "Vast Sea with the International Community" surrounding the "Land Area of Japan and Its Territory".

The points where the lines intersect show "Harmony and Contribution" among the areas, and the yellow circles are meant to express "Creativity".

Seen as a whole, the yellow line for the "Students and Faculty" and the green line for the "Land Area of Japan and Its Territory" form the inverted Chinese character of "Person", while the yellow line and the blue line for the "Vast Sea with the International Community" configure "Person" again. All together the lines shape the letter "N" for Nagasaki University.
